Routines – Mobile phones



No mobile phones, headphones or Air Pods are allowed anywhere at any time in the school building. If they are seen, they will be confiscated by any member of staff and taken to front reception.

- ☐ First Time Student to collect from reception at the end of the day.
- Subsequent Confiscations − Parent / carer to collect directly from school.

WHY? To reduce distraction / disruption phones cause during the school day. Phones are a barrier to learning, reduce concentration and increase the likelihood of pupils missing out on key information in lessons.



Routines - Behaviour policy

Our whole behaviour is centred around our **SSA Grades**. This system allows for us to identify issues with behaviour / conduct, in addition to reward and praise pupils who consistently follow the school's core principles.

SSA 1 = Outstanding (Need a pen and planner)	SSA 2 = Good
SSA 3 = Passive	SSA 4 / 5 = Negative Behaviour Continuing / Persistently failing to meet the core principles.

SSA \$ = Removed from lesson

This is a last resort and used with the primary aim of reintroducing the pupil to the class as soon as possible (if appropriate)



Attendance



- Changing shift in attitude towards full time education
- People think there's less value in attending school consistently
- People think its worth taking pupils our for holidays because they don't see the impact on their education

What does "Good attendance" mean?

■ 95+% Green ■ 95% Amber ■ Below 95% Red



Attendance

Pupil A has an attendance of 90%. The pupil and their parents feel this is good and are pleased.

Should they be?

1 school year at 90% attendance = 4 whole weeks of lessons MISSED!

90% attendance over 5 years of secondary school.... = half a school year missed!

Research suggests that 17 missed school days a year = a GCSE grade DROP in achievement (DfES)

The greater the attendance the greater the attainment.

Does something worry them about school? Find someone to talk to about it.



How can we improve or maintain good attendance?

- If you really are ill get someone at home to phone school on the first day of absence. Stay in touch with school and get back to it as soon as you are able to be here.
- Only take days off for genuine illness. (You will know!)
- Don't extend the weekend because of tiredness (they'll survive!)
- Avoid taking holidays in school time.

Students not sitting an exam will go to lessons as normal.




Revision - Organisation

MAKE SLEEP A PRIORITY

Without getting the proper rest it will be even harder to retain information. A good sleep of between 7-9 hours every night helps you have a relaxed and well-rested mind and body.



OVERCOME PROBLEMS

If you find you don't understand some of your material, getting stressed out won't help. Instead, take action to address the problem directly by seeing your teacher or revising on GCSEPod.





A healthy body = a healthy mind. Encourage your child to do at least 20 minutes of physical activity a day to help improve their focus and keep them relaxed.



Ensure your child is eating three healthy

meals a day and limit their caffeine and sugar intake. Power foods for your brain include blueberries, salmon and nuts!



Nervousness is a natural reaction to exams but bottling it up will only make it worse. Talk to your child about how they're feeling, it will help them to relieve any stress and worrying they maube experiencing.



KEEP THINGS IN PERSPECTIVE

Exams will seem like the most crucial thing, but in the grander scheme of things it's only a small part. Remind your child of this and tell them, they can only do their best and that's enough!



Create a mind map of the key points.




Journey It

Structure of the course

Examining Board: Pearson (Edexcel) 1MA1

100% exam. No coursework

Two tiers of paper – Foundation (grades 1-5) or Higher (grades 5-9)


For each tier of paper:

Students will sit 3 papers in total (80 marks each. A total of 240 marks)

- 1 non calculator paper (paper 1)
- 2 calculator papers (papers 2 and 3)

Each exam is 1hr 30mins long

Calculators are an essential requirement for students as two of the exams are calculator based, they are available on parent pay at a discounted price.





Maths mock exams

Our students will be practicing past papers throughout their GCSE course.

We also strongly encourage independent practice

- •There will be a formal mock exam at the end of half term to help identify the correct tier of entry.
- •There will be a formal mock exam in December where students will set 3 practice papers.
- •The dates for both these will communicated to students and parents via parent pay.




How to revise for Maths

Pearson or CGP revision guides, will be made available for purchase at some point during the GCSE course. They are a useful additional resource for students to refer to following a normal maths lesson.

They should be independently completing **revision workbooks** and referring to resources which are posted on the school's web site.

The school's web sit has a large number of past papers for downloading. There are websites such as "maths and Physics tutor", "Corbett Maths" and "Maths Genie", where you can access past papers and download papers which focus on specific topics. These all come with mark schemes and even tutorials to talk students through solving questions.






The Maths Department set their home learning using Maths Watch. KS3 Maths club is Wednesday lunchtime 504 – can support with home learning and logging on issues etc!



Vocational study (College)

Foundation level – individual entry requirements will be discussed at an interview with the college.

Level 2 – Four GCSEs at Grade 3 or above including a combination of Grade 2/3 or higher in Maths and English.

Level 3 – Five GCSEs at Grade 4 or above, including a combination of Grade 3/4 or higher in Maths and English.

Learners who do not achieve a Grade 4 in both English and Maths will continue to study these subjects as part of their Study Programme
