Dear Parents and Carers.

As the autumn term draws to a close, I would like to thank all parents and carers for your ongoing support. School will close for the Christmas break on Wednesday 20th December with students being dismissed at the earlier time of 12.00pm. We return on Tuesday 9th January 2023.

Students may wear their own clothes on Wednesday, with a Christmas theme or Christmas jumper for a suggested donation to school of £1.00 which can be paid via ParentPay.

This term has seen students achieve so much both in lessons and beyond the classroom. Our drama team performed a truly tremendous performance of Annie at the Storyhouse in Chester, creating magical moments for the school, followed by a superb music concert, which included outstanding performances from our dancers and musicians.

As you will be aware, Blacon High School was visited by Ofsted on the 28th and 29th November. The report will be published in the New Year and I will share more on this in January. I am proud of the way that students conducted themselves throughout the Inspection.

Winter Holiday Activities and Food Programme (HAF)

We want to let you know about some of the FREE activities available across West Cheshire throughout the holidays. Edsential, on behalf of Cheshire West and Chester council, have coordinated a whole host of Holiday Activities, funded by Department for Education, which are completely free for eligible Free School Meal children.

This Christmas there are a diverse range of activities on offer from trips to the pantomime, ice skating, graffiti art workshops, sports and much more. There will be free healthy meals provided throughout the programme, ensuring that children and young people stay nourished and energised throughout the holidays. There is also a leaflet attached with details of activities available for children with special educational needs, throughout the Christmas period. Please note that places need to be reserved for children with SEND. However, places can be opened to support siblings in families with SEND children.

Free School Meals

As a school we are conscious of the current cost of living pressures, and in relation to this, we are also aware from our records that a number of parents who may be eligible to claim Free School Meals for their children do not submit a claim to the Local Authority. I urge you to check eligibility, and make a claim if you believe you may be entitled.

Household Support Fund payments for children in receipt of Free School Meals (FSM)

The Government Household Support Fund helps support those most in need due to rising living costs, particularly around the need for food and fuel. Payments for households in receipt of Free School Meals will be made by the end of term in the usual way. Each eligible family will receive £15 per week, per child, so in total £30 per student for the two-week December holiday.

Measles and MMR Call to action

Due to an increase in measles cases across the country this year, including some recently in the North West, we are encouraging everyone to check that they and their children have had two doses of the MMR vaccine. The MMR vaccine is a free, safe and effective way to protect against measles, mumps and rubella. If you are unsure about your vaccination status, or need to book a vaccine, you can contact your GP practice to check and book an appointment.

If your child cycles to school, please can I urge you to ensure that they wear a safety helmet. School promotes that, for their own safety, all students cycling to and from school should wear appropriate head protection.
