Strategic Goal 1 – Attainment and Progress

What will this look like?

High achieving students who are inspired and engaged in their learning with the skills to continue learning throughout their lives. Pursuit of academic excellence. Ambition and high achievement for all students including SEND and disadvantaged. Students who exceed expectations of progress, irrespective of starting point or background.

KPIs

All key measures to be at national averages for:

- Progress 8 matching non disadvantaged nationally for Maths and English
- English and Maths grades 9-4 and 9-5





Strategic Goal 2 - Curriculum

To have a well-constructed, well taught thinking curriculum which promotes reading, promotes global awareness, engages and excites all learners to achieve their full potential.

What will this look like?

High quality experiences both in and beyond the classroom with extensive participation in enrichment, irrespective of background. Lessons which promote and facilitate a love of learning with opportunities to think and be challenged.

Accurate assessment which identifies learning needs and the next steps for students' learning with precise knowledge made clear.

Strategic Goal 3 - Learning and Attendance

To improve attendance in line with national averages, resulting in students who have consistently high attendance, positive attitudes and engagement in learning with a strong work ethic in preparation for the future.

What will this look like?

Opening minds to a love of learning and supporting a positive growth mind set with the resilience to persevere to overcome challenge.

- Reduce persistent absentees to below national average for disadvantaged students
- High engagement in learning through behaviour data
- Destinations data 0% NEET (Not in Education, Employment or Training)
- 60% of leavers join Level 3 A Level Applied and Technical Courses in 6th Form provision

To be a great place to work where staff are happy, enjoy their own learning and feel invested in due to outstanding professional development where staff are committed to the pursuit of academic and personal excellence.

What will this look like?

A professional Learning Community with outstanding, bespoke training delivered through collaboration and partnership, informed by research and pedagogy to maintain staff engagement and expertise in order to secure the best possible outcomes for students.

A self-reflective staff, highly qualified and well trained staff who value feedback to improve their own performance.

- Continued bursaries and successful destinations through Hope Opportunity Trust


Strategic Goal 7 – Building and Learning Environment
