Bank of America Mentoring Project

For the fifth year running, we been given the fantastic opportunity to work with the Bank of America. This is through The Cheshire and Warrington Pledge, a partnership between educators and businesses to link the world of work with young people and of which we are a member; this is aimed at our students working and liaising with employees from the bank on a mentoring project.

The aims of the programme are to provide advice, mentoring, guidance and information to students regarding plans for their future careers – especially those students looking to go to University. We will have 10 students taking part this year.

There will be 4 sessions in total: 2 sessions at school and 2 sessions at the Bank of America offices at **The Business Park, Wrexham Road, Chester, CH4 9QW.**

This first session will take place at the Bank of America and will be for 2 hours. Students will be attending with Mr Hughes, our Careers Advisor.

This will take place on **Friday 6th February 2026.**

We have transport provided and we will aim to get to the Bank of America for 9am – this will mean students need to be **in school for 8.30am** if possible for a prompt departure.

Students will need to be in full uniform, as they will be coming back to school for around 11.30 am, and will be back in lessons. We will give students 10-15 minutes when they return for a toilet break and a drink, as they will be missing break. Students can bring a snack if they would like to.

The remaining sessions will take place on the following dates:

13th February – one hour in school

27th February – one hour in school

Friday 6th March – two hours at the Bank of America.

School staff will be present during the sessions at all times. Permission for the 6th February and the 6th March will be requested via ParentPay.

This is an exciting opportunity for us and it could lead to further engagement with the bank and more events to support our Careers programme and young peoples' decision making for their future.
