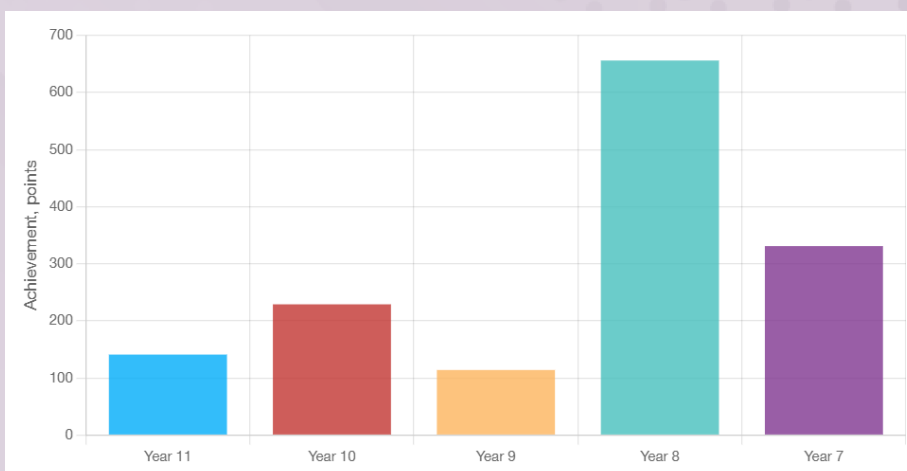
Spring symbolizes new beginnings, offering students the perfect opportunity to plant seeds of knowledge, develop their potential, and bloom into the best version of themselves.

# Attendance Matters - Every Hour, Every Day Counts...

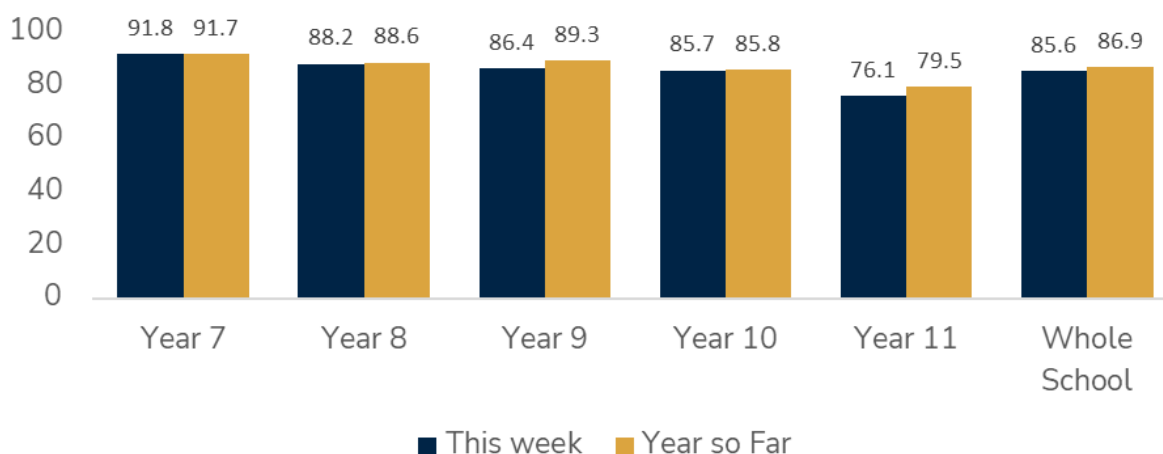
The attendance for the whole school so far is 86.9% with attendance for this week being at 85.6%.

Vince Lombardi was an American football coach who is considered by many to be one of the greatest coaches and leaders in American sports. He is perhaps best known as the head coach of the Green Bay Packers, where he led the team to three straight and five total NFL Championships in seven years, as well as winning two Super Bowls. Lombardi never had a losing season as head coach in the NFL, and was enshrined in the Pro Football Hall of Fame.

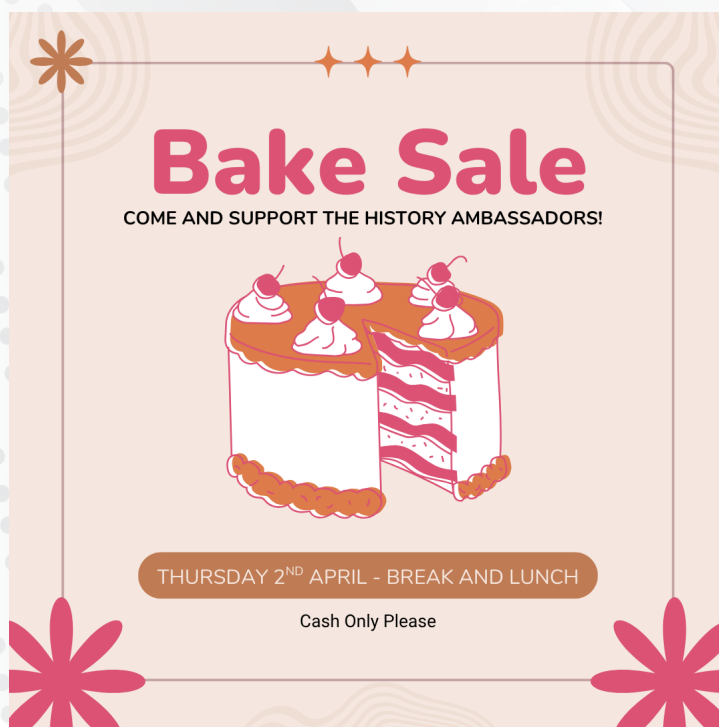

## Performing Arts Department

### Matilda Rehearsals

Dr Salisbury, Miss Bolwell and Mr Turner are pleased with the initial rehearsals at Drama Club as the ensemble begin to block the action and explore their characters, finding exciting ways to be creative with the storytelling. ## Performing Arts Department

### Storyhouse Production: Macbeth

Dr Salisbury and Mr Turner escorted our Year 10 Performing Arts group to a production of Macbeth at Storyhouse. Shakespeare's iconic tragedy returned to the stage in a bold new production, which brought the original text to life with power, pace and atmosphere. This production was the Macbeth we all know and love: the witches, the prophecies, the blood-soaked ambition – all in a haunting, high-stakes world where fate and power collide. The Shakespeare classic was adapted and directed by Jamie Sophia Fletcher, the new Associate Artistic Director at Leeds Playhouse. She is a director and musician specialising in musical theatre and new writing, with a passion for re-imagining productions and reframing classic stories for contemporary audiences.

The audience were treated to a workshop with members of the company following the performance, with the opportunity of working onstage in a rehearsal of one of the scenes with members of the cast. We received some lovely comments from members of the public who wanted to express how polite and well behaved our students were and how delighted they were to see our students enjoying the theatre experience.



### University of Chester PGR Conference

Dr Salisbury was delighted to be a keynote speaker at the University of Chester PGR Conference, hosted by the School of Education at the Exton Park Campus. She shared her research work with staff and students, focusing on the Criticality of Creativity in Education and was a guest on a Panel discussion alongside her colleague, Dr Amanda Kipling, which was chaired by Dr Martin Matthews. The value of reflective practice and arts-based research was explored in the development of a creative curriculum which equips young people with valuable skills that can be applied in any chosen career.

As a Research Fellow of the University and Visiting Lecturer, Dr Salisbury is frequently on campus delivering lectures to PGCE and Doctoral students in addition to participating in research projects with colleagues at the University. Her main research area is in the role of Drama in supporting the mental health and wellbeing of young people, and she is currently engaged in a number of research projects including: Rhyme and Reason with Curious Minds, Swedish Storytelling Project, and the transition from primary to secondary education.

## Job of the week

### The job of the week this week is an Aquaponics Technician

Aquaponics technicians help run systems that grow fish and plants together in a sustainable and eco-friendly way. In aquaponics, waste from the fish provides nutrients for the plants and the plants help clean the water for the fish. The technician looks after the day-to-day running of the system, including feeding the fish, checking water quality, fixing equipment, and making sure both fish and plants

stay healthy. They may work on farms, in research centres, or at educational sites.

To become an aquaponics technician, it helps to have knowledge of both aquaculture, fish farming, and horticulture, growing plants. Some people take college courses in agriculture, environmental science, or aquaculture. Others learn through hands-on work, or apprenticeships. Understanding how ecosystems work, having good problem solving skills, and being comfortable working with technology are all important. A strong interest in sustainability and science is also useful for this kind of role.
