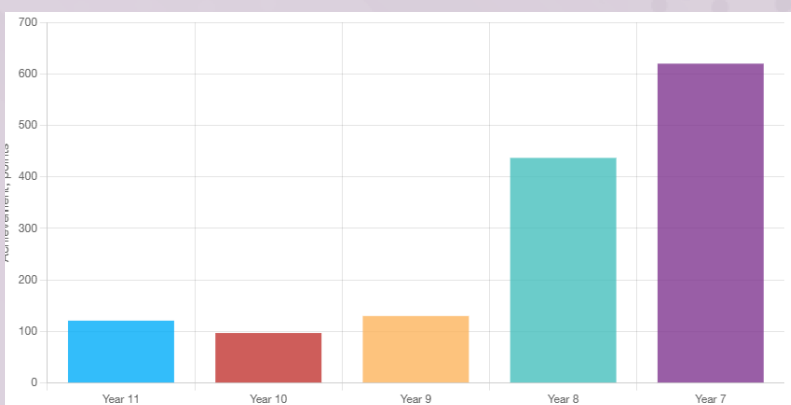

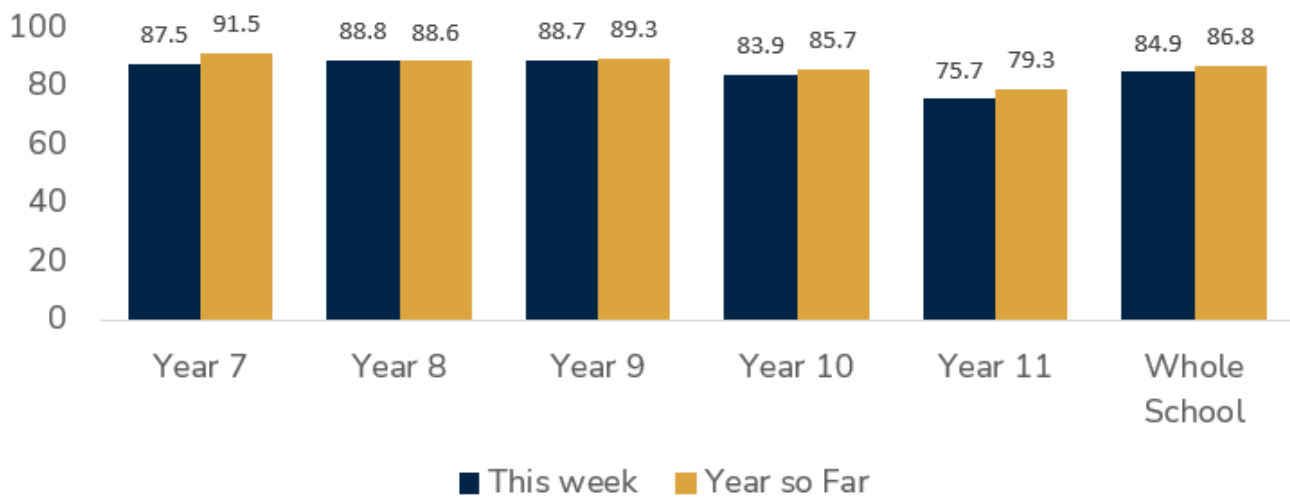
The attendance for the whole school so far is 86.8% with attendance for this week being at 84.9%.

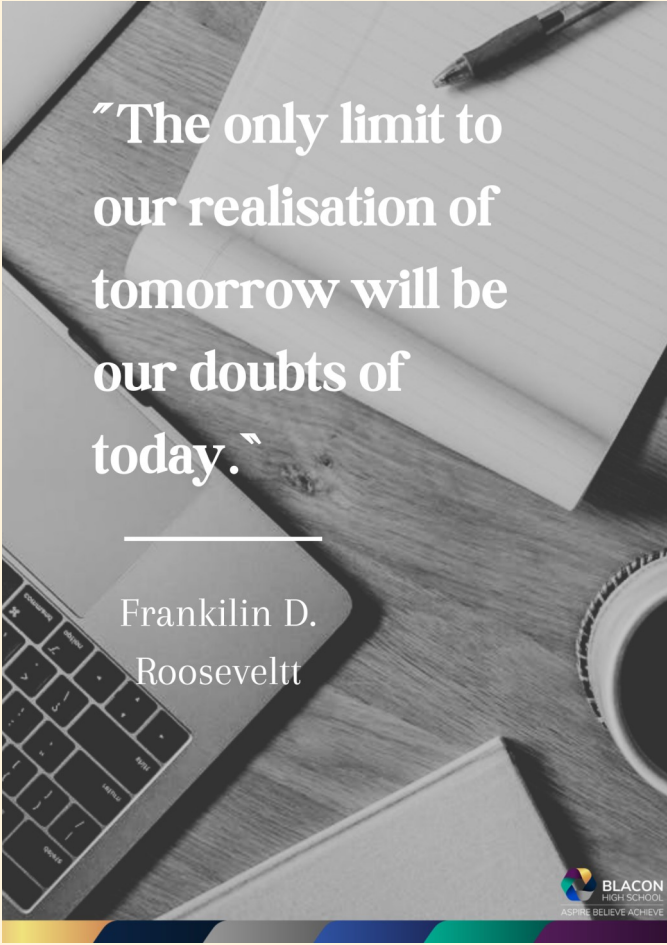

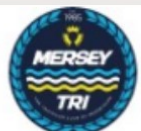

Duke of Edinburgh Training – Building Essential Skills



Students taking part in the Duke of Edinburgh's Award have been making excellent progress during their training sessions. So far, they have been developing key skills including basic first aid and map reading, both of which are vital for their upcoming expeditions.

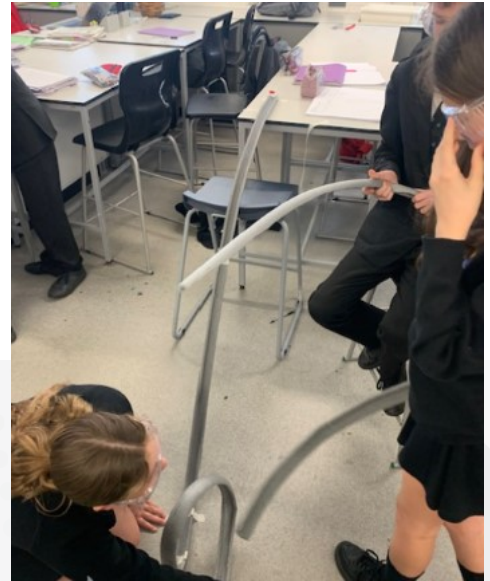


During recent sessions, students have been getting hands-on experience by practising bandaging techniques on each other, helping them to understand how to respond in a range of first aid situations. Alongside this, they have been learning how to read maps accurately and navigate using essential tools.

It has been great to see students working collaboratively, building confidence, and developing practical skills that will support them not only in their D of E journey, but also in everyday life.

Science Week – Inspiring Curiosity and Creativity

Students in KS3 had a fantastic time taking part in a range of exciting activities to celebrate Science Week. Throughout the week, students engaged in live lessons with Chester Zoo, where they explored topics such as conservation, habitats, and the role of science in protecting endangered species. They also looked at a variety of careers in science, helping them to understand the wide range of opportunities available in STEM fields.



Building on this, students designed their own science-themed LEGO characters inspired by the careers they had explored, showcasing roles such as conservationists, engineers, and laboratory scientists. This creative task helped students to connect their learning to real-world opportunities in science.

Each year group also took part in hands-on practical activities linked to their current topics. Year 9 students made bath bombs, applying their knowledge of chemical reactions. Year 8 students designed and built rafts, exploring concepts such as density, buoyancy, and forces. Meanwhile, Year 7 students created rollercoasters, linking their learning to energy transfers, and forces.

It was wonderful to see such enthusiasm and engagement from all students, with activities helping to bring science to life in a fun and interactive way.

Job of the week

The job of the week this week is an **Aquaponics Technician**

Criminologists study crime, criminal behaviour, and the justice system. Their job involves researching why crimes happen, how to prevent them, and how the police and courts deal with offenders. Criminologists often work with the police, government agencies, or universities to look at patterns in crime and suggest ways to reduce it. They might analyse data, interview criminals, or help shape policies that make communities safer.

A degree in criminology, sociology, psychology, or a related subject is usually needed to become a criminologist. Some jobs may also ask for a master's degree or PhD, especially for research or teaching roles. Work experience in areas like the police, probation service, or social work can also be helpful. Good research, communication, and analytical skills are important for anyone wanting to succeed in this career.

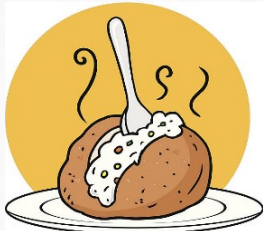
