Thank you to all parents for our partnership and your ongoing support. I wish you a restful break over the Easter period and look forward to welcoming everyone back on Monday 20th April.

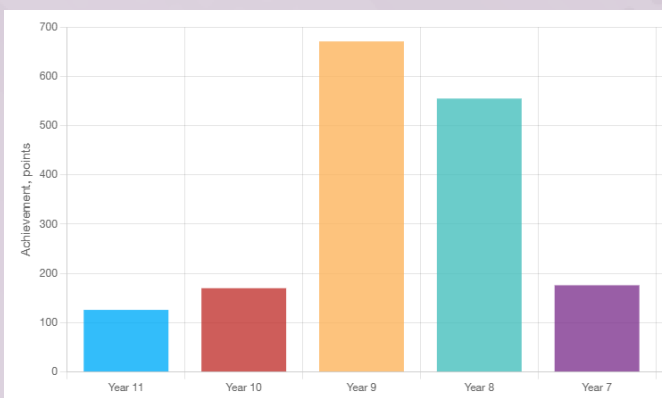

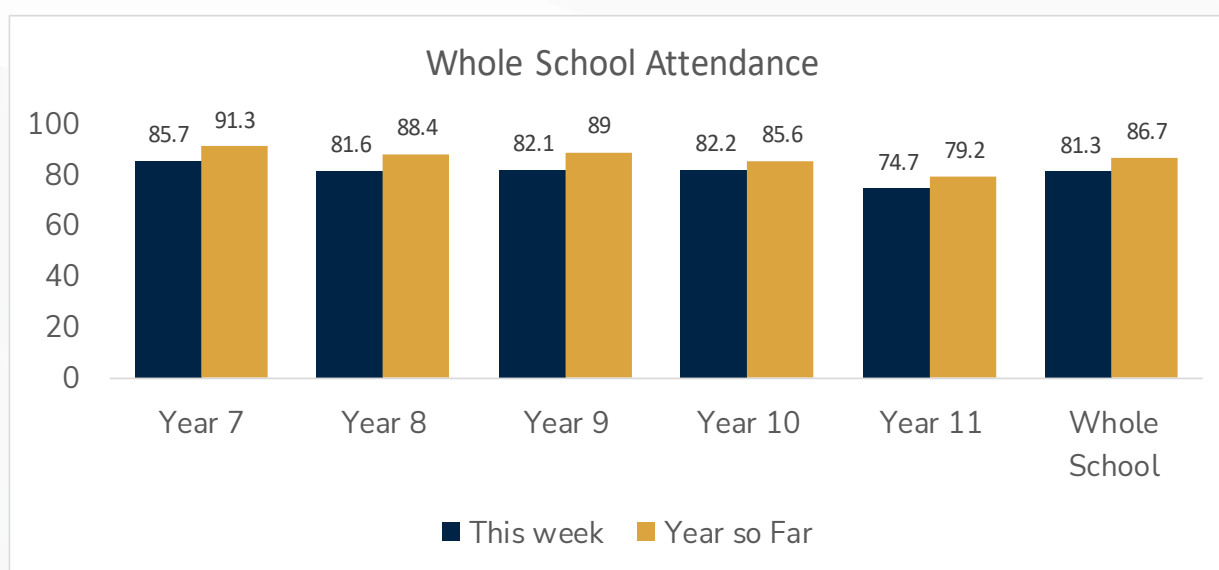

We're so proud of them, they were absolute stars and made the whole day such a special experience!

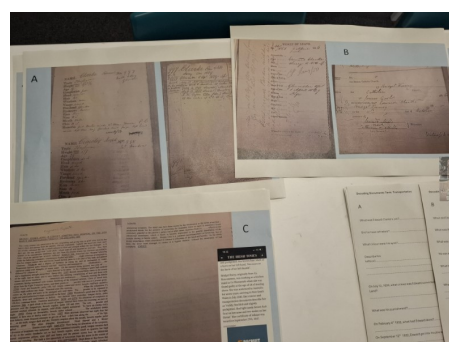


Year 10 Historians Step into the Past

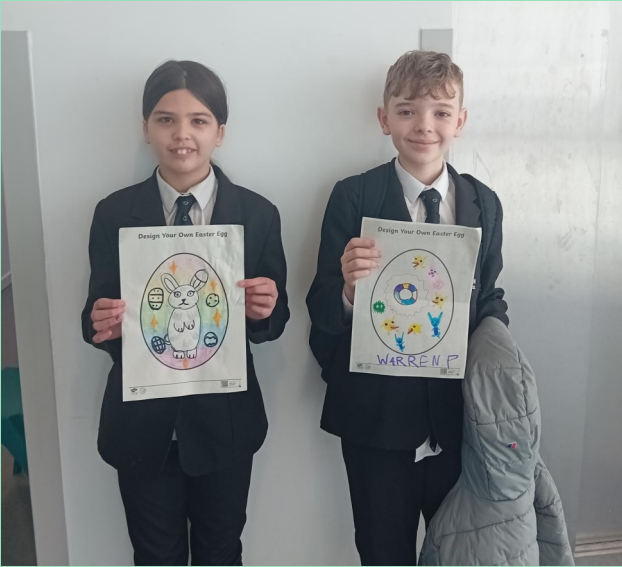

Crisis and Resilience Fund - Support for Families Continue


The Government's Household Support Fund will end on 31 March 2026 and will be replaced by a new Crisis and Resilience Fund from 1 April 2026.

Job of the week

The job of the week this week is a helicopter pilot

Helicopter pilots fly helicopters for a range of purposes, including search and rescue, air ambulance services, transporting people or goods, and even filming for TV or news. Their job is to plan safe flight paths, check weather conditions, inspect the helicopter before flying, and communicate with air traffic control. Some pilots work for private companies, while others work with emergency services or the armed forces.

A private pilot's license PL is needed followed by training for a commercial pilot's license corporal H if they want to fly for a living. Training can be expensive, so some people join the military or apply for sponsorships. Strong concentration, good teamwork, and staying calm under pressure are key skills for a helicopter pilot.


