

## Headlines - Message from the Head

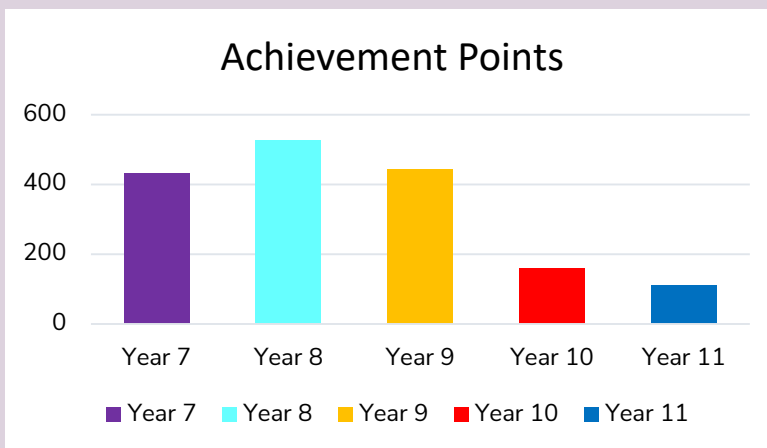

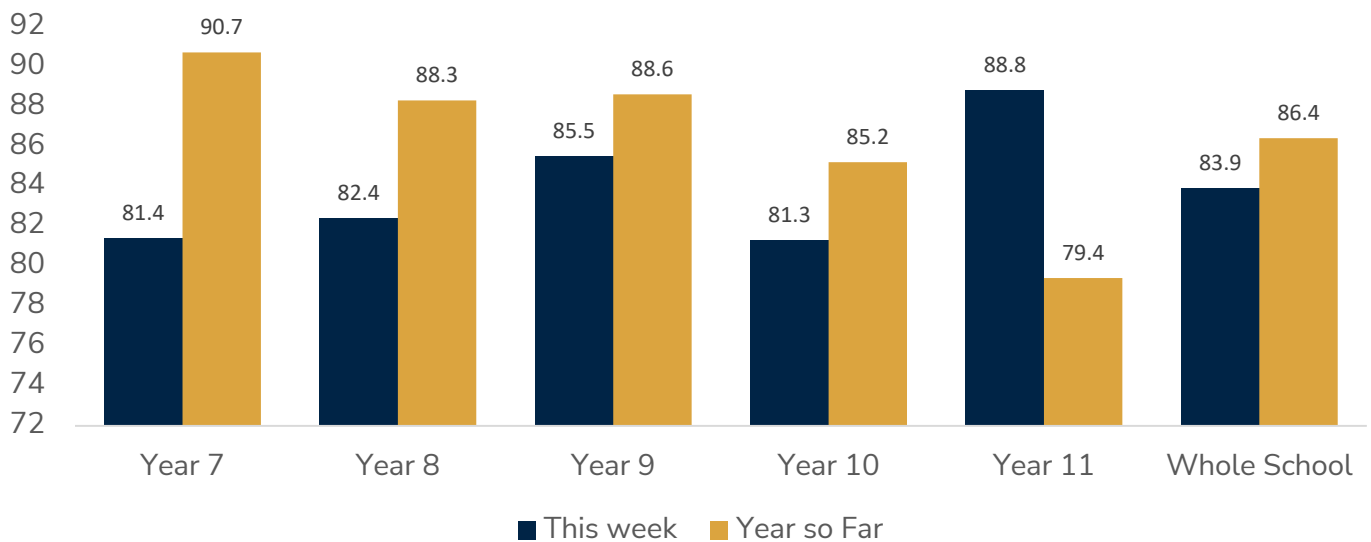
The attendance for the whole school so far is 86.4% with attendance for this week being at 83.9%.

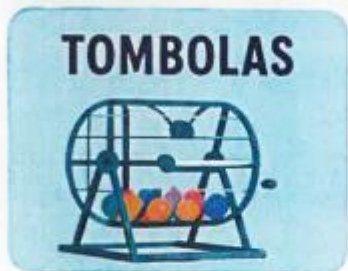
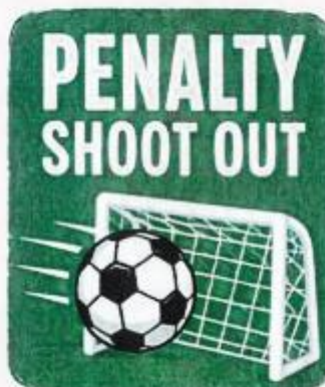

## Job of the Week

**Forensic accountants** investigate financial records to uncover fraud, theft, or other illegal activities. Their job is a mix of accountancy and detective work, often involving close examination of bank statements, invoices, and business accounts.



They may work on cases involving stolen money, business disputes, or organized crime. Forensic accountants often write reports for use in court and might be asked to give evidence as expert witnesses. They can work for the police, government, law firms, or private companies. To begin this career path, many complete a degree in accounting, finance or maths, followed by professional qualifications with organizations like ACCA, CIMA or IC AEW. Employers usually look for people who are detail focused, good with numbers, and able to spot unusual patterns.

### Year 7

Year 7 students have recently completed their Hooks and Riffs project, where they performed memorable riffs from popular songs alongside ostinatos from classical music. This exciting topic includes African singing and drumming, Chinese pentatonic music, Indian raga and American blues.


